EDSP 670 February 2-4, 2017 SCMEA In-Service Conference (Graduate Credit)

Welcome to Columbia and the 2017 SCMEA In-Service Conference. This year's conference promises to be especially exciting. Please read below the requirements and process for obtaining graduate credit through Furman University for this workshop.

1. **Attend 15 clock hours of sessions.**

In addition to regular sessions, you may count concerts, banquets (if there is a program and a speaker), divisional business meetings, and exhibit time viewing curricular materials.

2. **Keep a diary of the events you attend. Provide me with a document that includes a BRIEF 3-4 sentence summation of each event you attend. (REQUIRED) This does not need be a lengthy transcript, but rather a synopsis of the things you learned or observed at each event. Evaluate the sessions as you deem appropriate, but a possible line of thought may be:**

- a. Which clinician did you think was most effective and why?
- b. Did you hear any new music or find materials that would be effective in your teaching situation?
- c. Did you gather any advice or materials on advocacy that can assist you in your teaching situation?
- d. Would you recommend the clinician to a colleague?
- e. How did the conference/session help you grow as a musician a/o teacher?

Because of the reduced fee structure for this year's course, there will be no faculty response to the document you present.
