SCMEA Hall of Fame Lisa Rayner

Lisa Rayner is currently in her thirtieth year of teaching, the last twenty-eight of which have been as music specialist at Pontiac Elementary School in Richland School District Two. At Pontiac, Ms. Rayner teaches general music to eight hundred students in both the traditional grade K-5 classrooms, as well as the Montessori Magnet mixed grade classrooms. She also directs the Pontiac fourth and fifth grade chorus after school. Her first two years of teaching were spent in Clarendon School District II at Alcolu Elementary School, where she was named Teacher of the Year after her second year of teaching. At Alcolu, Ms. Rayner taught general music, band, and chorus to all of the district's fifth and sixth grade students.

Ms. Rayner serves on the Richland Two Arts Leadership Team as the district's elementary music lead teacher, and in 2018-2019 was named an Honor Roll Finalist for District Teacher of the Year. Ms. Rayner is the Assistant Director of the award-winning Tri-District Arts Consortium (Tri-DAC), an auditioned summer intensive program for students gifted and talented in the performing and creative arts from Richland School District Two, Lexington School District One, and Lexington/Richland School District Five. In 2021, Ms. Rayner was named one of ten Community Concert Truck Heroes by the University of South Carolina School of Music. She represented the profession of teaching during the pandemic and was honored with a personalized Concert Truck performance and celebration.

Ms. Rayner holds a Master of Education degree in Education Administration with elementary principal certification from the University of South Carolina, and a Bachelor of Music degree (summa cum laude) in Music Education with choral and instrumental certification from Columbia College (SC). She is a Past-President (2015-2017) of the South Carolina Music Educators Association (SCMEA), a Past-President (2009-2011) of the Elementary Division of SCMEA, and has served on the Southern Division Board of the National Association for Music Education (NAfME), the NAfME Council for General Music Education, the South Carolina Council of Arts Education Presidents (CAEP), and the first National Advisory Council for Quaver Music (now QuaverEd). Previous appointments include the Sandlapper Singers Board of Directors, the South Carolina Philharmonic Education Committee, and the South Carolina Elementary Honor Choir Committee. She currently serves as Parliamentarian and Events Marketing Chair on the Executive Board of SCMEA. As a flutist, Ms. Rayner has performed with various churches and ensembles around the state. She currently sings alto in the Schola Cantorum at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Columbia where she also serves as the music librarian.

Hunter Cox is the piano and AP Music Theory teacher at Andrew Jackson High School in Kershaw, SC. He has taught at Andrew Jackson High School since 2019. He graduated from Appalachian State University with a Master of Music degree in Piano Performance. He also holds Bachelor of Music degrees in Piano Performance and Music Education from Appalachian State. Mr. Cox currently serves as Organist and Music Director at Trinity United Methodist Church in Darlington, South Carolina. He also serves as the immediate past president of the South Carolina Music Educators Association Piano Division and Media and Communications Chair for the South Carolina Music Teachers Association. Mr.Cox lives in Camden, South Carolina with his dog, Schroeder the Westie.

Courtney Vance is a native of Irmo, South Carolina. She earned her Bachelor's in Music Education with a Flute Performance certificate and a minor in Theater from Newberry College in 2018. Ms. Vance recently finished up her Master's in Music Education at the University of Florida. Currently, she is working on her Master of Education in Trauma Informed Education at Columbia College. Her goal is to gain a doctoral degree in Music Education to continue to serve band directors and students in South Carolina. Outside of the classroom, Ms. Vance enjoys reading, hiking, hanging out with friends and family, and spending time with her fur children.

Ms. Vance is a member of the South Carolina Music Educator's Association, the South Carolina Band Director's Association, The National Association for Music Education, and the South Carolina Education Association. Ms. Vance served on the SCBDA Winter Ensembles Committee during the 2022-2023 school year. Ms. Vance currently serves on the SCBDA Concert Performance Assessment Committee. She serves as the Assistant Band Director of the Symphonic Band at the Tri-District Arts Consortium. Continuing to hone her craft is important to Ms. Vance. She performs professionally with the Carolina Wind Symphony in Columbia, South Carolina.

Ms. Vance serves as the Music Teacher/Choral Director at Inman Intermediate School, Director of Bands at Campobello Gramling School, and Assistant Band Director at Landrum High School. Under her baton, these programs have shown immense growth. In 2020, Ms. Vance made school history at Inman Intermediate School by having their first student participate in the SCMEA Elementary Honors Chorus. During the 2022-2023 school year, Ms. Vance started the first-ever 6th-grade choral class at Inman Intermediate School.

The Campobello Gramling School Band program has grown exponentially under her direction. During the 2021-2022 school year, the school received its first superior rating at the SCBDA Concert Performance Assessment and received the prestigious SCBDA Outstanding Performance Award for the first time in school history. The school had its first student make the SCBDA Junior All-State Band during the 2022-2023 school year. The Campobello Gramling School "3" O Clock Jazz Band" was founded in 2022. The band participated in the SCBDA Jazz Performance Assessment and received its first superior rating in school history. Ms. Vance continues to encourage a tradition of excellence in her students through community and school performances.

Fay Sprouse is in her 23rd year as Superintendent of Ware Shoals School District and in her 40th year of education. She earned her Doctor of Philosophy degree in Educational Leadership from Clemson University, Master's Degree in Administration and Supervision from Furman University, and Bachelor's degree in Elementary Education from Erskine College.

In 2022, she received the Erskine College Distinguished Service Award, the most prestigious of the awards presented by the Alumni Association, which recognizes service to one's church, community, profession, and Erskine over the span of one's lifetime. In 2019 she was the recipient of the Burdette Leadership Award which honors women who have made significant contributions in the Upstate region of SC. She serves as church musician/choir director for two churches in Ware Shoals.

Fay and her husband, Billy, have been married 43 years. They have two children and six grandchildren. She will retire in June.

Dr. Richard O'Malley has been the Superintendent of the Florence One Schools for the past six years. Prior to coming to South Carolina, Dr. O'Malley served as Superintendent of New Jersey for 15 years focused on ensuring that all students achieve at the highest level of academic success, mental health supports, ensuring equity for all students and enhancing the arts and athletics. His leadership in Florence has earned the district the respect and recognition locally, statewide and nationally for innovations in technology and learning. During his tenure as Superintendent, Florence One Schools and staff have been awarded numerous national grants and awards including National Blue Ribbon Schools and SC Palmetto's Finest Awards.

During this time in education, Dr. O'Malley has benefited from a broad range of experiences in several school districts while working in various teaching, coaching and administrative positions at every level, PK-12. Dr. O'Malley has been a catalyst for change in South Carolina, especially in the area of teacher and staff benefits. He spearheaded the parental leave law being implemented in school districts and has provided innovative benefits for his staff including, paid health benefits, tuition reimbursement, and numerous salary and bonuses for staff.

Dr. O'Malley is truly a friend of the arts and music community, who clearly understands the importance of the arts and music as a superintendent and supports it financially. He has spearheaded a district wide investment in the arts, from success on stage with drama and musical performances to art education of all media, earning state and national recognition for the Florence One Schools. Dr. O'Malley's work to preserve and enhance quality music education programs and inspires others to pursue higher education and strive for greatness are continuously exemplified in his educational pursuits. He is commitment to ensuring every student in the district has equitable access to music education and together with staff, they have transformed music education across the district's campuses.

Dr. O'Malley's leadership has led to substantial change in Florence One Schools and recognition statewide through numerous awards. He has been recognized as the Superintendent of the Year by the South Carolina Athletic Directors and Nurses Associations and was the recipient of the SC Arts Educators Association Superintendent of the Year and the Palmetto State Arts Education Art Administrator of the Year.

Dr. O'Malley attended Clemson University for his undergraduate studies and has a doctorate in Educational Administration from Seton Hall University. He currently lives in Florence, South Carolina with his wife Christina, who has been married for 26 years and has three beautiful children; Ryan (23) who attends MUSC in Charleston, Kaitlin (21) a senior at Clemson and Emma Claire (19) a sophomore at Clemson.

Honors achieved by bands under Mr. Grantham's direction include: Eight SC State Marching Band Championships, Twelve SC Upper/Lower State Marching Band Championships, Three BOA Regional Class Marching Band Championships, Thirty-Four Concert Performance Assessment Superior Ratings, and Twenty-Eight SC OPA's.

Mr. Grantham served the SC Band Directors Association for twenty-five years as Region Chairman and received the 2017 Distinguished Service Award. He holds professional memberships in NAFME, Phi Beta Mu, ASBDA, Phi Mu Alpha, Kappa Kappa Psi, and received National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Certification in 2005.

Mr. Grantham has served as an adjudicator/clinician in South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia, Kentucky, and Virginia. He consults for band programs throughout South Carolina with assistance/mentorship and continues to serve the SCBDA in a number of capacities.
